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Organization of Classes in Grade 9

The current 8th grade will be reshuffled and students will be reassigned to any of six sections of the 9th grade.

German Language Partner Tongue

The learning of the "partner tongue" receives strong emphasis at the John F. Kennedy School and is a core component of the school's bilingual, bicultural program.

German partner tongue instruction is offered on four different levels:

D4 beginner (one year)

D3B intermediate (one year)

D3A advanced intermediate (two consecutive years D3AI and D3AII)

D2 advanced

Students intending to complete the *Abitu*r must achieve German Partner Tongue level D2 by the beginning of the 11th grade.





Foreign Language Requirements for *Abitur* Student

Courses in foreign languages are chosen so that students fulfill the requirements for the Abitur.

- 1. At JFKS, English is automatically the first foreign language (erste Fremdsprache).
- 2. Enrollment in the second foreign language (zweite Fremdsprache) must happen:
 - a) at the beginning of grade 7 and continue *consecutively* through the end of grade 10 (in either French or Spanish), or
 - b) at the beginning of grade 8 and continue *consecutively* through the end of grade 12 (in Latin, Spanish or French).

There is no possibility to start a second language after grade 8 and receive the Abitur.





9th and 10th Grade Math

- Parents choose whether quarterly tests taken in 9th grade and 10th grade math classes will count toward 40% or 30% of the overall math grade. The remaining 60%-70% of the overall math grade is based on classroom quizzes, homework, and participation.
- If a student has selected the "Reduced Test Weight" option whereby tests count as only 30% of the overall grade for either 9th or 10th grade, the student will not have the option to pursue the German Abitur in 11th /12th grade.
- Students who opt for the reduced test weight would have "Reduced Test Weight" included on their report card with their math grade.
- Rationale: In order to earn the American Diploma, students must pass three full years of math between grades 9 and 12. This requirement is not the same for the German Abitur. The "Reduced Test Weight" option is meant to create a "safety net" for students who struggle in math but must pass three years of math between 9th and 12th grade.





Elective Options

- Designed to expose students to subjects for later AP courses or Leistungskurse in grades 11 & 12
- Two or three hours per week are available for an elective.
- Course offerings are dependent on sufficient enrollment and the availability of a teacher.

- Two Options:
 - Language Electives CONTINUED from 8th grade
 - Non-Language Electives





Elective Options - Language

FRENCH LATIN SPANISH

Note:

- Language electives are a "<u>long term decision</u>"
- If the language is dropped for another elective, it cannot be picked up again
- •The individual languages may be continued in grades 11 & 12 in both the High School Diploma and the Abitur programs
- "Latinum-Vermerk" will be awarded if Latin is continued through 12th grade

Music Ensemble (optional)

Starting in 9th grade, ensembles are graded classes

- Concert Band (Concert Band Instruments)
- Choir
- Orchestra (String Instruments)

Anyone is welcome who has previously played an Ensemble at JFKS or outside of school.

- & Possibilities for participation at AMIS festivals
- Abitur students may register for these classes as a Grundkurs.

Religion Class in High School

- ★ Religion Classes continue in High School, grades 7-10
- ★ Classes are 1x a week during 6th hour
 (eat during class get a pass to get in the front of the lunch line)
- ★ 1x a year, students go on a educational class trip

Religion Class in High School

Registration:

- ★ Students register for their religion class of choice in the transition from 6th to 7th grade
- Registration rolls over from year to year, 7-10th grades, without the need for renewed registration each year
- ★ To change/unregister, students simply give the religion teacher a signed/ written note from a parent/legal guardian at the beginning or end of the school year

Exit Certificates

Grade 10: MSA (Mittlerer Schulabschluss)

Federally recognized and legal exit certificate that a student can use to enter an apprenticeship or training program.

Possible to change school type (ex, Oberstufenzentrum)

Grade 12: Abitur

Highest German school certificate.

Allows for free entrance into German university Recognized worldwide

Standardized program with required exams

Requirements: D2, 3rd language Includes grades 11 & 12 only

Grade 12: Diploma

Accredited by NEASC and recognized worldwide Can be used in the US, Canada, Europe and Germany (with selected passing AP exams) Advanced Placement (college-level courses) No language or math requirement

Requires 26 credits from 9-12 grades





Program Choices

High School Diploma Abitur

Students may decide which "path" or program they will pursue:

- American High School Diploma
- German Abitur

Basic courses for the Diploma and the Abitur are included in the regular program for 9th and 10th grade students at JFKS.





High School Diploma

- The diploma is accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC).
- It is recognized by Universities in the US, Europe, and **Germany**. Some additional requirements apply (i.e., AP classes).
- Credits and grades for HSD transcripts start accumulating in the 9th grade and are officially listed and counted in the final GPA.
- ALL grades count starting now!
- Primarily taught in English.
- NOTE: Abi students also have a 9-12 transcript; colleges outside of Germany may request it.

Transition Grade 8 to Grade 9





Diploma Requirements

GPA calculation – ALL grades 9th through 12th

English 4 Credits

German 1 Credit for each year of attendance at JFKS

(U.S. Colleges require 1-3 years of one language)

Social Studies 4 Credits (with 1 credit required in U.S. History)

Science 4 Credits

Math 3 Credits (U.S. Colleges prefer 4 credits)

P.E./Sport 2 Credits

+Electives

Total: <u>26 Credits</u> (minimum)

Note: A 5+ is failing. There is no credit recovery possibility at JFKS.





Abitur / Gymnasiale Oberstufe

- The *Abitur* is considered the general university entrance exam in Germany.
- Officially begins in grade 11.
- **Primarily** taught in German.





Abitur Requirements

- Necessary prerequisites for the Abitur
 - At least D2 German Language level by end of 9th grade
 - 2nd Foreign Language
 - Standard Math

AND

- MSA (Mittlerer Schulabschluss) is passed in 10th grade
- •An 8th grade student in D4 can not reach D2 level by the end of 10th grade and is therefore not eligible for the Abitur
- Abitur students will also receive a High School Diploma assuming they have a:
 - Passing grade in math and english all 4 years
 - Passing grade in US American History
